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WHO ARE WE

ERASMUS PARTNERSHIP: RE-COGNITION PROJECT

Recognition is an Erasmus KA2 partnership project between the University of Prishtina in Kosovo, DNS College in Denmark, INEX in Czechia and De Amicitia in Spain. The Re-cognition project encourages strong connections between formal and non-formal education institutions across Europe. This initiative aims to bridge the gap between academic learning and real-world experiences, enhancing educational activities by integrating volunteering and non-formal education with university curricula.

One of the key components of this project is the organisation of a 3 weeks bus travel from DNS College in Denmark to the University of Prishtina in Kosovo.

INEX - SDA

DNS COLLEGE

"DNS" is an abbreviation for "Det Nødvendige Seminarium" which is Danish for "The Necessary Teacher Training College". We proposes a 4-year Bachelor Programme that aims to enable its students to become global citizens and proficient educators, able to act and meet future challenges.

The DNS programme is tightly intertwined with a lifestyle. Throughout the duration of the programme, students and teachers' study, travel, work, do sports, cook, and share life together. For this reason, DNS can be described as an intentional community with an educational twist.

DNS has a lots of experience in organising bus travel with groups of students. In the first year of the program, students together with teachers go on a 4 months bus travel to Western Africa. We also propose 5 weeks summer camp bus travel to Tunisia or Morocco.

THE GOAL OF THE BUS TRAVEL

The goal of the bus travel follows the headline of the Erasmus Recognition project of engaging learners in non-formal education (NFE) activities and evaluating its impact on the development of soft skills in the participants.

The travel aims to equip its participants with a strong experience of non-formal education. Throughout the project, you will experience and learn from different places working in the field of non-formal and formal education. Together with the other participants, you will form a strong team, meet many diverse people, and spread your knowledge and experiences of non-formal learning for others to benefit from.

For 3 weeks, the bus will be your home, one that you will share with 15 other people. It is a great opportunity to learn how to collaborate, communicate and organise with a group of people with whom you will rely on and be responsible for. You will live together in the bus and share the daily tasks, from cooking and cleaning to planning the route and assisting the driver with navigation.

By reflecting on the experiences, as an individual and as a team, you will gain an understanding of how NFE activities can help to develop soft skills and acknowledge the learning that happens during the travel. Throughout the journey, you will be encouraged to discuss and share with the group what you are learning and what you can observe.

The Bus Travel ends at the University of Prishtina in Kosovo, where the Prishtina International Summer University is held, and the participants will join this international event for a few days - with the option of staying for the duration of the event.

WHAT WILL YOU DO?

You will be travelling by bus for 3 weeks, from Denmark to Kosovo. On the way, you will stop at various organisations, communities, educational centres, and more. You will learn about NFE from exchanges with people you meet and experiences gained in the different places. You will reflect on the gained experiences, as an individual and as a team. The travel will also include an investigation (field research) in some of the travel countries - which will allow you to find new ways of discovering new knowledge.

During the travel you will also organise events, activities and presentations to practice NFE methods yourself. In the summer school in Kosovo you will present a workshop related to what you have learned from the experience.

WHAT WILL YOU GET OUT OF THIS EXPERIENCE

This 3-week experience is intense, and you can get a lot out of it.

You will get an unforgettable, international experience travelling by bus with 15 diverse people from all over Europe. Learning from other cultures from within the group and also from those you will meet on the way.

You will get an understanding of different non-formal educational activities and how they can benefit the learning and development of soft skills.

You will develop further your soft skills, such as teamwork, decision-making in a team setting, facilitating workshops, etc.

ABOUT THE TRAVEL





THE HISTORY OF DNS BUS TRAVELS

DNS has existed since 1972 and one of its key pedagogical tools is the bus and the concept of travelling to learn. To train teachers effectively in the global perspective, we believe that you need to meet different realities and perspectives. Reading and memorising facts and data can only go so far. For over 50 years DNS has been sending its students on busses for months into different parts of the globe. Originally, this was from Denmark to India, through the middle East, but with the current geopolitical situations, we now send students to Guinea-Bissau.

On this travel, students are sent away from the bus in each of the countries they visit to learn first-hand about different topics that they find relevant, whether it is trade and economy, women's rights, climate change, or culture. We call this experience an investigation.

On top of the first-hand knowledge that students gain on these investigations - the bus travel is also a key part of the programme in developing the soft skills of each student. How to cooperate and work in a team, how to take important responsibilities, how to take leadership, how to organise and so much more.

For this travel to Kosovo, we have adapted our traditional travel to focus on the soft skills gained during such an experience, but we will also include an investigation in the Balkan region.







7+ COUNTRIES

The travel starts in DNS Denmark College, where you will stay for a few days with the other participants to prepare the travel to come, get to know more about the project and about each others. You will then go south through Germany, Czechia, where you will visit some summer camp from the NGO INEX - SDA. You will continue through Slovakia. Hungary, Croatia, Albania, and Kosovo. You will stop on the way in different NGOs, schools, educational centers to learn from NFF Activities You will also conduct a field investigation in Balkan countries.

PRISHTINA INTERNATIONAL SUMMER UNIVERSITY

Since its establishment, Prishtina International Summer University (PISU) has played a key role in the internationalization of higher education in Kosovo, bringing together students from diverse backgrounds to foster academic and professional growth.

The aim of PISU is to unite local and international students and professors, promoting the exchange of knowledge and experiences. Additionally, it seeks to strengthen cooperation between the University of Prishtina and international institutions.

The summer university offers students the chance to attend specialized courses, earn extra credits, and enhance their academic performance. Our vision is to develop a high-standard summer program that enriches students' knowledge and skills, encouraging academic achievement.

PISU has hosted over 6000 students and 400 lecturers, and is organized by the Vice-Rector for International Relations and the Office for International Relations.

The 25th edition of the Prishtina International Summer University (PISU) will take place from July 7th to 18th, 2025, at the University of Prishtina. The program will offer 16 courses in various fields of study, with 200–300 students, including participants from Europe and the Balkans.

Courses will cover areas such as social science, law, economics, agriculture, medicine, and more. Each course will have an international and a local teacher, with teaching in English. Participants who attend at least 80% of classes and pass exams will earn 4 ECTS credits.

Public forums and recreational activities, including weekend excursions, tournaments, and social events, will also be part of the program. Participants will receive certificates based on Bologna standards, signed by the professors.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

CONDITIONS

The project is open for anyone older than 18 years old and having a European Passport (or visa that allows them to travel in Europe). There is no prior experience required to be part of this project. We welcome anyone curious about non formal education, working in group settings, travelling and learning about the world through first-hand experiences. **The course will be in English.**

You need to be ready to

- Be an active part of the team, following safety and security agreements and being dependable
- Share a living space during the travel period
- Be part of the cleaning and cooking rotas and other responsibilities
- · Stick with the group and make decisions together
- One of your tasks will be to document your journey via Social Media handovers and to create stories, posts and videos - so you must be willing to be active on social media and conquer the task together with your team

FEES AND PRACTICALITIES

COST

The travel is part of an Erasmus funded project, and therefore all the expenses of the bus travel (bus expenses, food, program, etc) is covered.

The participants need to pay for their tickets to reach DNS Denmark and to return from the University of Prishtina. These tickets are able to be partially refunded depending on your sending organisation - get in touch with us to find out more.

PRACTICALITIES

The bus will be equipped with a basic kitchen, so you will be able to cook and eat in the bus.

You will mainly be sleeping in tents, and be provided a room while staying at DNS Denmark and in University of Prishtina in Kosovo.
